

In the evening, settle down to some serious relaxation, and perhaps try one of the nearby public onsen baths – an amazingly relaxing experience once you've let the hot water soak away any initial shyness! Day 10 8th Mar Sat	NARA DAY TRIP A day trip to Nara for the impressive giant bronze Buddha – Japan's largest – housed in the famous all-wood Tōdai-ji temple.  Walk through Nara-kōen Park, which is home to very friendly local deer who will follow you hoping for tasty treats! The Kasuga Taisha Shrine, which dates from Nara's time as the capital of Japan, is also located in the park and is well worth a visit.
