Art Mon Zen offers fifteen individually designed rooms which are ornamented at every turn with the beauty and craftsmanship of the *sukiya-zukuri* style of architecture; the pride of Japan and recognised all over the world. These rooms are decorated with domestic and international works of art selected with an exacting aesthetic sense. All rooms are outfitted with beds, bubble bathtubs, air conditioning, and amenities of the highest quality.

The hotel is located in the northern part of Gion near the Kamo River on Furumonzen Street, the foremost antique art district in all of Kyoto. The Tatsumibashi, the symbol of Gion, is a mere stone's throw away. Popular sightseeing spots within walking distance include Chion-in Temple, Maruyama Park, Yasaka Shrine and Kodaiji Temple.

#### **Room Description**

A penthouse-type room designed to make the most of its location on the top floor. The space created by the sloped ceiling and the large glass windows that open out to both the west and the north provides a sense of spaciousness and makes the room feel like a part of the Kyoto cityscape. In the interior, the techniques of sukiya-zukuri, which originated in Kyoto, have been applied at every turn, giving a Japanese dignity and warmth to the modern design of the room. Uncompromising comfort has been pursued in both the function and layout of the bathroom. Featuring a large, circular jacuzzi and separate shower room, this is the perfect place to relax after the stress of a long trip.

Accompanied by your guide, begin your day at Kiyomizu temple, which looks out over the city from the hillside. From there, continue down the slope, past Kodai-ji temple to Yasaka-jinja Shrine and into Maruyama Park.

There are plenty of places to stop for a traditional lunch, and plenty of shopping too! Here is the perfect place to start souvenir shopping, or if you have an eye for traditional arts, you can pick up some lovely ceramics, kitchenware, and kimono amongst a whole host of other goodies.

Finish your tour in Gion where you can often catch a glimpse of Kyoto's apprentice Geisha on their way to their evening appointments.

Start the day with your guide by visiting some of the iconic sights in the North West of the city. You'll be seeing the stunning Golden Pavilion and Ryoan-ji Zen Garden before visiting the nearby Ninna-ji Temple, which houses one of Kyoto's loveliest gardens.

Spend the afternoon exploring Arashiyama, an area in the West of the city. The famous bridge here has been depicted for centuries in woodblock paintings. The area has an old-timey atmosphere, and is a popular spot for kimono wearing in the Spring and Autumn.

The area is also famous for its bamboo grove, located right by the stunning UNESCO Tenryu-ji Temple. It is here that you can see the picture-postcard view of the green towers of bamboo swaying in the breeze.

Also of interest here is Jojakko-ji temple, founded in 1596, and the Okochi Sanso Villa.

#### Day 4



Spend the day exploring independently at leisure. We suggest visiting Nara - a great place to escape from modern Japan. See the impressive giant bronze Buddha - Japan's largest - housed in the famous all-wood Todai-ji temple. Then enjoy a walk through Nara-koen Park, which is home to very friendly local deer who will follow you hoping for tasty treats! The Kasuga Taisha Shrine, which dates from Nara's time as the capital of Japan, is also located in the park and is well worth a visit.

On your way back into Kyoto, why not stop off at the Fushimi Inari Taisha? This is one of Japan's most revered shrines and is famous for its thousands of red torii gates leading up the hillside. A visit here is the perfect way to work up an appetite for Kyoto's wonderful cuisine.

## Day 5

# Overnight luggage transfer: Kyoto - Miyajima

To allow you to travel comfortably your luggage will be sent from Kyoto to Miyajima overnight. We suggest packing a small overnight bag as you will be without the bulk of your luggage for your final evening in Kyoto.





Make your way to a traditional machiya townhouse, where you will first have a tour of the machiya before being dressed in kimono for your Tea Ceremony, perhaps the most enigmatic of the traditional arts. This will be followed by a light, Kyoto style lunch.

Spend the afternoon exploring independently at leisure. We suggest a visit to nearby Nishiki Market, a long, narrow covered street packed with shops selling local specialities which is sometimes referred to as Kyoto's kitchen. Barrels of fresh and pickled vegetables spill out into the street, and the air is fragrant with the savoury smell of grilling *sembei* crackers and steaming fish dumplings. Many of the shops offer free samples, and the Nishiki Market is a wonderful way to stock up on very Japanese picnic supplies for lunch.

Next, we recommend heading to Nishijin Textile Centre, where you can learn about the fascinating process behind the manufacturing of the kimono. In addition, there are daily kimono shows, displaying the beauty and potential of this beautiful garment.

Perhaps finish your day with a visit to the nearby Nijo Castle, the former home of the Tokugawa Shogun. On exploring the beautifully decorated interior, you can walk on the 'nightingale floors', so-called because the design of the floorboards causes them to squeak when stepped upon - almost like a chirp. End your visit with a stroll around the lush gardens.

You will be met on arrival in Hiroshima and taken on a half-day tour.

Begin by visiting Hiroshima's Peace Memorial Park and Museum. This is likely to be most moving part of your holiday to Japan. The spacious park is full of memorials dedicated to those who lost their lives on August the 6th 1945, as well as those who later succumbed to diseases, and is also home to the famous Atomic Bomb Dome. The paper cranes found everywhere represent solidarity with these victims and an on-going prayer for world peace. The Peace Memorial Museum is in two buildings within the park, and while visiting it can be an upsetting and unsettling experience for many, it should not be missed.

If time allows, we also recommend visiting the lovely Shukkeien strolling gardens. Shukkeien's name can be translated into English as "shrunken-scenery garden", which is also a good description of the garden itself. Valleys, mountains, and forests are represented in miniature in the garden's landscapes. Through carefully cultivated land and vegetation, the garden mimics a variety of natural formations and scenic views.

Shukkeien has a long history dating back to 1620, just after the completion of Hiroshima Castle. The garden displays many features of the traditional aesthetics of Japanese gardens. Around the garden's main pond there are a number of tea houses which offer visitors ideal views of the surrounding scenery.

At the end of your tour you will be transferred to your accommodation on Miyajima Island. This will involve a ferry crossing.

Today spend some time exploring the sacred island of Miyajima, which is lovely to visit at any season. See Itsukushima Shrine and its famous 'Floating' Torii, the 5 Tier Pagoda and Daisho-in Temple. Cable car to the peak of Mt Misen for stunning views across the island studded Inland Sea. Deer are traditionally believed to be messengers of the gods and wander the island freely.



## Day 9



Spend the day relaxing. You might like to spend the day at your resort, or instead head to a beach. The front desk will be able to arrange a taxi to take you anywhere you want to go.



Your guide will meet you after breakfast and you'll set off first of all for the Hiji Falls, roughly an hour from the hotel. The waterfall can be accessed in an attractive and easy hike (approx 40 mins) along a nature trail through the forest. Because of the area's small population there has been much less human encroachment on the habitat of the area's wildlife than elsewhere on Okinawa main island and accordingly, a much larger diversity of wildlife can be found in the area. Visitors will have the chance to see a number of animals unique to the area, such as particular species of bird, turtle, snake and lizard.

From there you'll head on to visit the Nago Pineapple park, where you can learn about one of Okinawa's main exports before visiting the Nakijin Castle Ruins. Originally built in the late 1200s, the castle ruins are located lush forests, that bestow them with a unique atmosphere.

Head on to end the day at the Churaumi Aquarium, widely considered Japan's best and where the highlight is the massive Kuroshio Tank, one of the largest in the world and which contains a wide variety of species, the most striking of which are the giant whale sharks and manta rays.

Takefue, an idyllic rural retreat, maintains a refined rustic style, the farm-type buildings all black beams and straw-and-plaster stucco. Interiors are likewise rustic, but with modern amenities and huge windows giving access to the lovely surrounding forest. The onsen hot springs are generated by the same geological processes that keep nearby Mt. Aso rumbling. There are numerous ryokan in the neighbourhood, but the bamboo forest effectively muffles all sounds from outside the grounds, preserving the feeling of deep-forest privacy.

Most of the rooms boast their own private rotemburo outdoor baths - some of which are huge. There is also an enormous public rotemburo, which can be reserved for private bathing.

The cuisine is kaiseki haute cuisine, incorporating inaka ryori, or country fare, and taking full advantage of the delicate and delicious mountain vegetables of the area.

Takefue's location, nestled in a large bamboo grove, gives it a unique otherworldly air; this and its exquisite food, beautiful outdoor baths, rustic authenticity and premium service make this an outstanding ryokan.

A lovely Japanese style room, Omachian has a vast 5 metre outdoor hot spring bath made of cypress as well as an outdoor foot-bath and separate indoor cypress bath.

The room has two separate Japanese style spaces for living and sleeping and a separate dressing room.



Spend your day visiting Mt. Aso, the volcano with which Kumamoto is synonymous. Mt. Aso is an active volcano in the centre of Kyushu which most recently erupted in 2016 but has since calmed down again. Aso's ancient caldera ranks among the world's largest, with a diameter of up to 25 kilometres and a circumference of over 100 kilometres. In the centre of the caldera stand the mountain's active volcanic peaks, including Mount Nakadake, whose spectacular crater is accessible to tourists.

#### Day 13



This morning your guide will take you to Ontayaki Pottery Village. The mountain village of Onta was established by visiting potters and is famous for its ontayaki pottery, which is characterized by geometric patterns. Workshops are built side-by-side in this, crammed into the small amount of space available. The Onta district has ten pottery studios and only ten! In order to preserve their traditional production methods, the number of studios is restricted. At each pottery studio, the production techniques for their pottery are passed down from parent to child from generation to generation.
