### Day 2

From there you'll venture over to the trendy districts of Harajuku and Omotesando: the former is the centre of Japanese teen culture, bursting with life, and the latter boasts more buildings by great modern architects than anywhere else. Omotesando is often referred to as the Champs Elysees of Tokyo, with an abundance of luxury shopping. In Harajuku you can also enjoy sampling some of the areas great desserts.

You'll then explore Shibuya, one of Tokyo's busiest, most colourful districts, and home to the famous 'Shibuya Crossing.' The area has many great, typically Japanese game arcades which will give you a real taste of modern Tokyo!

This afternoon, you'll explore Shinjuku, one of Tokyo's largest shopping and entertainment districts. You'll ascend the Tokyo Government Metropolitan building which offers breathtaking views over this incredible city.



Part of the same group that operate the lovely Byakudan, Gen Hakone was completely renovated in 2021 into a stylish, contemporary style ryokan. Located in Gora, overlooking Mt. Myojogatake, Gen Hakone offers guests sublime views of that and other Hakone mountains from its stylish and spacious rooms, which all have wooden terraces with outdoor hot spring baths.

With very little light pollution, the night-time views of the starry skies are wonderful and for guests staying in mid August, they can be thrilled by an unobstructed view of the Hakone Daimonjiyaki fireworks festival.

Dinners are delicious multicourse kaiseki meals of local, seasonal ingredients. Gen's cuisine is based on the natural flavours of the four seasons, and is created with delicate Japanese cooking techniques, bold cooking methods, and a dash of style and flair. Breakfasts are also Japanese style but Western options are possible with advance notice.

The ryokan also offers a range of Spa treatments, which feature relaxation based on the theme of Mindfulness. Spa treatments are performed by therapists trained and certified by the Esalen Institute in the US and allow guests to enjoy a high quality treatment experience in the comfort of their room while enjoying the stunning view.

## **Hakone Freepasses**

We have included Hakone Freepasses to cover most of the local transport in the Hakone area, except taxis.



Spend today exploring independently at leisure. We recommend setting out on the circular tour of the Hakone area by mountain train, funicular railway, cable car, and boat. Weather permitting, there are great views of Mount Fuji from the cable car and from Lake Ashi. If you're feeling energetic, the old cobbled Tokaido Road to Hakone-Yumoto can be walked in full in an afternoon, or you can choose to return by boat across the lake.

Alternatively, if art appeals, the Open Air Museum houses an impressive array of international art and sculpture, including over 300 works by Picasso alone. Hakone offers more for art lovers and the Pola Museum of Art in nearby Sengokuhara features a wide range of artworks by both Japanese and Western artists, set in a forest of 300 year old beech trees and housed in a glass and concrete construction designed to blend in with the surrounding nature. Also in Gora is the Hakone Museum of Art, which showcases mostly Japanese ceramics and also has a lovely moss garden.

From here you will head back towards the centre of Kyoto, to Kiyomizu dera, overlooking Kyoto from the base of the eastern mountains. This temple is renowned for its construction, which uses no nails to support the elaborate wooden structure of the main hall. Finish your tour with a stroll around Gion, the geisha district where you may be lucky enough to spot a geiko or apprentice maiko scuttling off for their evening appointments.

### Day 6



Start the day by visiting some of the iconic sights in the North West of the city. You'll be seeing the stunning Golden Pavilion and Ryoanji Zen Garden before visiting the nearby Ninnaji Temple, which houses one of Kyoto's loveliest gardens. Spend the afternoon exploring Arashiyama, popular as a retreat from the city since the Heian Period. Most famous for its beautiful bamboo groves and river bridge, there are many stunning temples to visit as well. We especially recommend visiting Tenryu-ji Temple to see its breath-taking Cloud Dragon ceiling, Gio-ji for its lovely moss garden and Otagi Nenbutsuji, a small but charming temple, hidden away at the far end of the Arashiyama neighbourhood and featuring 1200 stone sculptures of rakan, the Buddha's disciples, all with different facial expressions and poses. The statues are scattered amongst a few small temples and pagodas. The statues themselves are well worth spending time admiring; many are covered in moss and with all the different expressions, you're sure to find one you love!

Today you will enjoy a rickshaw ride around Arashiyama. In this 30 minute course, you'll start from Togetsukyo Bridge and head into the bamboo groves. The path takes you past Tenryuji Temple and Nonomiya Shrine and on to the Rakushisha hermitage before returning to your start point.



First you will drive over to Takenaka Carpentry Museum to take in the beautiful artistry of some of Japan's most treasured artisans. The museum is a mecca for architecture enthusiasts from Japan and all around the world who flock there to learn more about the craft which goes into traditional Japanese wooden construction techniques.

Next you will journey over to Kobe's waterfront to the Hyogo Prefectural Art Museum. The sleek structure will delight architecture nerds who will enjoy the signature style of the Tadao Ando designed building. One of the largest art galleries in Western Japan, it houses a large collection of both Western and Japanese artists which you can enjoy leisurely.

Kobe is a port city located in the Kansai region of Japan, known for its scenic views, modern architecture, and rich history. Situated between the sea and the Rokko Mountains, it offers a unique blend of urban and natural beauty. Kobe is famous for its high-quality beef, called Kobe beef, and is also a hub for international trade and culture. The city was one of Japan's first ports to open to foreign trade in the 19th century, which led to its diverse cultural influences. Key attractions include the Kobe Harborland, the iconic Kobe Port Tower, and the scenic Mount Rokko.



The better the quality of the carpentry tool, the greater is the likelihood that it will be used until it wears away and disappears. Moreover, technological development during the post-war rapid economic growth as exemplified by the spread of machine lumbering and electrically powered tools, has resulted in a dramatic decrease in carpenters who use hand tools.

The Takenaka Carpentry Tools Museum was opened in 1984 in Nakayamate, Kobe, as the only museum of carpentry tools in Japan, with the objective to collect and conserve such disappearing tools as a cultural heritage, and to pass them on to the next generation through research and exhibitions.

More than 35,000 pieces of materials have been collected so far. We have been involved not only in conserving remarkable tools from the past, but also in holding diverse events such as exhibitions, lectures, seminars, classes outside of the museum, and workshops, to convey the skills, wisdom, and spirit of the people who make masterful use of tools, as well as the resulting architecture and the culture of wood that surrounds it.

In autumn 2014, the museum embarked on a new chapter, relocating to a location near Shin-Kobe Station that has strong ties with Takenaka Corporation.

Japan is a nation of monozukuri (making things). Carpentry tools contain within them the characteristic aesthetic sensibilities and attention to detail of the Japanese people. We aim to be a place for coming into contact with tools to make new discoveries, and for providing new stimuli to the traditional way of making things.





The process is influenced by daily changes in temperature, humidity, and the positions of the moon and planets, creating a dynamic collaboration with nature.

Maintaining the perfect blue requires careful attention, with natural materials used to balance the dyeing solution. Unlike chemical dyes, this natural indigo from Awaji Island offers a deep, rich blue that reflects the island's fertile terroir. It's a journey into the unique, timeless beauty of natural dyeing.



The museum building, designed by Ando Tadao and itself a work of art, is mostly located underground and uses exclusively natural light to illuminate the artwork. This creates a viewing experience that is heavily influenced by the surrounding natural environment.



Opened in time for the 2010 Setouchi Triennale, the Lee Ufan Museum is one of the more recent additions to Naoshima. The museum features works by the Korean contemporary artist Lee Ufan, who was born in Korea but has been working and teaching in Japan. On display are large installations made of stone, concrete and huge slabs of iron, as well as a number of paintings from earlier in his career.



The Ando Museum looks like a regular, traditional residence from the outside, blending in perfectly into the town's neighbourhood. The inside of the building, however, combines traditional interior design with Ando's signature use of concrete, creating a rather intriguing atmosphere. Explanatory signs and photographs along the walls document Ando's activities on Naoshima and elsewhere.

Benesse House is a unique fusion of modern architecture and art that has a growing legion of worldwide fans. Designed by Japan's most famous architect, Tadao Ando, the hotel successfully marries art, architecture and nature in a stunning environment.

Guests have a choice of four separate hotel areas in which to stay: Oval, Museum, Beach and Park. Suites in the Oval section are above the main Museum and are accessed by a private monorail. Guests here and those staying in the Museum rooms also have the special privilege of being able to wander the museum late at night in their pajamas should they wish while it's almost entirely empty of other visitors; a true 'Night in the Museum' experience!

The hotel has two excellent restaurants, serving Japanese and French cuisine but we highly recommend reserving tables for dinner long in advance of your stay as spaces are limited and outside of the hotel, there is almost nowhere to dine out on the small island.

The staff at the hotel speak good English and are extremely attentive of guests' needs. There's a shuttle bus which visits some of the island's art installations as well as taking guests to and from the ferry port. Several of the installations can be visited on foot from the hotel but we also recommend renting electric bikes, which offer a great way to explore the island.

You will be met by a private car and driven around Teshima to enjoy the art tour. The highlight of the journey being a visit to Teshima Yokoo House. A collaboration between artist Tadanori Yokoo and architect Yuko Nagayama, it was created by renovating an old private house facing the harbor that forms the entrance to Teshima Island.

Once you've taken in your fill of the sights, you will be transferred back to the port for your cruise back to Naoshima!

A rural island in the Seto Island Sea, Teshima has joined Naoshima and the surrounding islands as a haven for contemporary art. Visit the calm Teshima Art Museum, as well as "Les Archives du Coeur", on the eastern end of the island where visitors can record their heartbeat and listen to the heartbeat of others.

Several more artworks are scattered around the island's three fishing villages. Most are open almost everyday, especially the larger museums and outdoor installations, however some of the smaller artworks are only open on weekends and holidays.



The Teshima Art Museum hosts a single piece of artwork and is located on the island of Teshima. Operated by the Benesse art Foundation, it has been designed by Ryue Nishizawa. The museum building is made of an impressive freestanding concrete shell.



A collaboration between artist Tadanori Yokoo and architect Yuki Nagayama, Teshima Yokoo House transforms an old private home into both a gallery and a work of art in itself. Making full use of the building's existing layout, the exhibition areas are divided into a "Main House," a "Warehouse," and an "Outhouse," displaying 11 two-dimensional works. Other features-a stone garden with a pond, and a cylindrical tower-are devoted to installations, so that the art spaces seem to expand symbolically to cover the entire site, making it a philosophical zone that simultaneously calls to mind thoughts of both life and death. Thanks to the building's use of tinted glass to control light and color, the sunshine, breezes, and natural hues of the island, as well as the artworks themselves, assume a range of different appearances, turning visitors' spatial experience into a series of interconnected collages.



## Transfer · Private cruise to Takamatsu Port

You will set off on a private cruise from Teshima to Takamatsu today, cruising through the azure waters of the Seto Inland Sea.



You will be met by your guide at the port upon your arrival in Takamatsu and whisked away for a half day tour of the beautiful peninsula of Yashima. Providing the perfect viewpoint over the Seto Inland Sea, Yashima is a peaceful place to spend the afternoon soaking in the delights of nature. The view is especially spectacular from Shishi-no-reigan, a viewing platform from where you can get the best panoramic views of the area. Another must visit spot is Yashimaji, part of the great Shikoku temple pilgrimage trail.

We recommend exploring the beautiful Ritsurin Koen, which once served as a second residence for the lord of this province and which covers an impressive 75 acres. Though named for its chestnut trees, Ristsurin is now dominated by beautifully sculpted pines, which cover the tsukiyama, or artificial hills, and the banks of the large ponds. We highly recommend having a cup of thick, green, matcha tea at one of the tea houses in the garden the Kikugetsu-Tei in particular has lovely views out over the pond and for the price of tea you can wander through the traditional building.

Your tour will finish back at Takamatsu Station, from where you will take bullet train to Shin-Osaka station.

The capital of Kagawa Prefecture, Takamatsu has been the political and economic centre in the region since the Edo period. Situated on the northern border of Shikoku and facing the Inland sea, A must-see location is Ritsurin Park, which features pavilions and ponds against a background view of Mt Shiun. Built by local feudal lords over more than a hundred years during the Edo period, it is renowned as one of the most beautiful landscape gardens in the country. In addition to visiting other attractive sights such as the Kompira-san temple which offers stunning panoramic views across the area, we recommend you taste Takamatsu's own noodles, Sanuki udon, famous for being inexpensive and delicious.
