WHAT IS YOUR FAVOURITE BIKE TRAIL IN JAPAN?

It has to be the bike trail along the east side of Kamogawa river in Kyoto during the summer. After 7PM, when it's more fresh and quiet, this path is a great way to discover the whole city, passing by rows of *machiyas* (traditional houses), iconic temples and watching fireflies on the northern side of the river.


